2018-2019 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DISTRICT ENGINEER for the EAST CHARLOTTE DRAINAGE DISTRICT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

The East Charlotte Drainage District (District) was created in 1965 pursuant to Chapter 298, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 69-110, Laws of Florida. The District provides drainage and roadway maintenance services to the lands of the District, which encompass approximately 5 square miles of citrus groves.

The District's fiscal year runs from October 2018 through September 2019. Primary activities over the past year to date (October 2018 – April 2019) have been related to canal and road maintenance as well as weed control.

1.2 Purpose of Annual Report

Section 298.26, Florida Statutes, instructs the District Engineer to submit a written report to the Board of Supervisors (Board) on an annual basis, at a minimum. The purpose of this report is: (A) to advise the Board of work completed and improvements made to District facilities; and (B) to make recommendations and suggestions for additional work and/or improvements.

Progressive Water Resources, LLC (PWR) was retained as the District Engineer in October 2014 to provide services as authorized by the Board of Supervisors.

The District General Manager maintains detailed records of all matters related to the maintenance and operations of the District, and this information is available for review at the District office by landowners within the District. Accordingly, the scope of this Annual Report is to summarize the status of special projects being undertaken by the District and to make recommendations for future activities.

2.0 MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

Detailed records of any road maintenance activities conducted are available in the monthly Field Reports maintained on file at the District office.

2.1 Canal Maintenance Program

• 5,290 linear feet of canal maintenance completed by Desoto Excavating in the North

Outfall Canal in Section 17 in the last quarter of the last fiscal year. No canal maintenance has been reported through April of this fiscal year.

2.2 Culvert Replacement Program

 Installed two 95" x 67" x 50" culverts in West Perimeter Canal in Section 34 in the last quarter of the last fiscal year. No culvert maintenance has been reported through April of this fiscal year.

2.3 Roadway Maintenance Program

 Placed 940 tons of shell and graded 6.25 miles of roads in Section 14, 21, 27, and 34 in the last quarter of the last fiscal year. No roadway maintenance has been reported through April of this fiscal year.

2.4 Weed Control

 Aerial application of 63 acres and treated 3 miles of west perimeter canal with round up custom in the last quarter of the last fiscal year. Aerial application of 76 acres and treatment of 3 miles of west perimeter canal with round up custom occurred through April of this fiscal year.

3.0 WATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT ACTIVITIES

The District holds a Water Use Permit (WUP) with the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) and provides monthly meter readings of permitted wells each month to SWFWMD. Also as required by the District's WUP, the meters were calibrated on 3/23/18.

4.0 SUMMARY

The District maintained treated 76 acres and 3 miles for weed control through April 2019.

Recommendations for the additional actions in the coming year include need to discuss lateral canal in Section 16, block 56; and compliance efforts associated with the District's WUP that will need to continue (pumpage reporting, crop reporting, etc.).

It is also recommended that an inventory and verification of all onsite water withdrawal locations be conducted and incorporated into GIS data base.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, provides two viable alternatives for the levy and collection of existing special assessments; and

WHEREAS, Section 197.363, Florida Statutes, allows a taxing authority, at the option of the Property Appraiser, to continue to collect special assessments utilizing the county method of tax collection; and

WHEREAS, Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, allows a taxing authority to utilize a uniform method of levy and collection of non-ad valorem assessments upon passage of a resolution determining to do so; and

WHEREAS, the Property Appraiser may agree to enter into an agreement with the District pursuant to Section 197.363, Florida Statutes, to continue to collect special assessments for 1992 and thereafter pursuant to that section of law; and

WHEREAS, the Board may determine it is in the District's best interest to utilize Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, for 1992 and years thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines it is in the best interest of the landowners of the District to authorize utilization of both methods in the discretion of the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the legal description of the District, being the real property subject to the levy, is as follows:

All of the following described property, located in Township 40 South, Range 26 East in Charlotte County, Florida:

Section 14: The West one-half of Section 14 and the West

one-half of the Northeast one-quarter.

Section 15: The Southeast one-quarter of the Northeast one-

quarter.

Section 21: The South one-half.

All of Section 16 and 22.

Section 23: The Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest

one-quarter.

All of Sections 27 and 34, together with all easements and rights-of-ways heretofore acquired by East Charlotte Drainage District.

The Boundaries are legally described as follows:

Commencing at the Southeast corner of Section 34 run north on the east lines of Section 34, Section 27 and Section 22, to a point on the east line of Section 22, comprising the Southwest corner of the Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 23, thence run east along the line of the Northwest onequarter of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 23 to the southeast corner of the Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of said section, thence run north on the east line of the Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 23 to the northeast corner of the Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 23, thence run west on the north line of the Northwest one-quarter of the Southwest onequarter of Section 23to the east line of Section 22, thence run north to the Northeast corner of Section 22 and the Southwest corner of Section 14, thence run east on the south line of Section 14 to the Southeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 14, thence run north on the east line of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 14 to the northeast corner of the Southwest one-quarter of Section 14, thence run east on the south line of the west one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 14 to the Southeast corner of the West one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 14, thence run north on the east line of the West one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 14 to the northeast corner of the West one-half of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 14, thence run west on the north line of Section 14 to the Northwest corner of Section 14, thence run south on the west line of Section 14 to the Northeast corner of the Southeast corner of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 15, thence run west on the north line of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northeast onequarter of Section 15, to the northwest corner of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northeast one-quarter of Section 15, thence run south along the west line of the Southeast one-quarter of the Northeast one-quarter of section 15 to the southwest corner of the southeast one-quarter of the northeast one-quarter of Section 15, thence run easterly on the south line of the northeast onequarter of Section 15 to the west line of Section 14, thence run south along the west line of South 14 to the northeast corner of section 22, thence run west along the north line of Section 22 to the Southeast corner of Section 16, thence run north on the east line of Section 16 to the Northeast corner of Section 16, thence run west on the north line of Section 16 to the Northwest corner of Section 16, thence run south on the west line of Section 16 to the Southwest corner of Section 16, thence run east on the south line of Section 16 to the Southeast corner of Section 16, thence run south on the west line of Section 22 and the east line of Section 21 to the Northeast corner of the South one-half of Section 21, thence run west on the north line of the South onehalf of Section 21 to the Northwest corner of the South one-half

WHEREAS, the Property Appraiser of Charlotte County has provided East Charlotte Drainage District the information required by Section 197.3632(3)(b), Florida Statutes, in a timely fashion, and East Charlotte Drainage District has determined that such information is sufficient for the District's purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved:

The Board of Supervisors of the East Charlotte Drainage District hereby authorizes that the District assessment shall be assessed on a per acre basis at an amount of:

ECDS 1 – Shell Roads Maintenance	\$ 2.89	per acre

LETTER OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement between East Charlotte Drainage District (ECDD) and Joshua Water Control District (JWCD) is supplemental to the existing Inter-Local Agreement. It provides for management, administrative and maintenance inspection services to be provided to ECDD by JWCD for the sum of \$24,000.00 per year.

In addition to the services, ECDD and JWCD further agree to the following:

- 1. This agreement shall be in effect for a period of one year; at the end of which time it shall be renegotiated based upon manpower, time, and cost incurred. JWCD will maintain records to verify actual time, manpower and costs.
- 2. All materials and contract repair costs will be paid by ECDD. In cases where it appears that economically, more efficient services can be obtained by JWCD, JWCD will purchase and invoice them ECDD for reimbursement with no profit.
- 3. If additional manpower or equipment services are needed by ECDD and JWCD is in a position to provide them without detriment to its own operations, JWCD will provide the services at cost to ECDD.
- 4. This agreement shall begin October 1, 2019 and terminate September 30, 2020 or be renegotiated for another one year period.
